Vanessa Anthony-Stevens holds a doctorate in Language, Reading and Culture from the University of Arizona. Her academic formation is in the areas of educational anthropology and Indigenous education. Anthony-Stevens' research explores discourse, identity and school achievement in bicultural/intercultural indigenous education, and in the preparation of teachers to serve diverse communities.

Description:

As a researcher and teacher-educator, Anthony-Stevens analyzes contexts of education from a socio-cultural perspective. She approaches research and teaching as practices of social justice, where privileging community relationships, power-sharing, co-authorships and praxis are central to the process and product of scholarship. This workshop will explore strategies that research institutions can take to best serve Native American students in STEM research fields through focus on nation building and institutional transformation.
